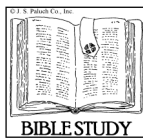

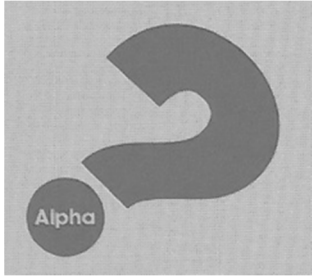

ALPHA COURSE INFORMATION

What is Alpha? Alpha is a series of sessions that explore the Christian Faith. The evening consists of dinner, a video and small group conversation. Each week we look at a different question around our faith.

**OUR FIRST ALPHA CLASS WILL BEGIN
TUESDAY, JANUARY 23, 2018 from 6:00 to 8:30 p.m.
(time approximate)**

WHAT IS ALPHA? Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, often repeats that the best thing we have in our lives is to **know** Jesus and the best thing we can do in our lives is to **share him** with others. Alpha invites participants to come to **know** Jesus in a more personal way and to enter a deeper relationship with him. The deeper relationship energizes participants into their Baptism mission of sharing their Jesus with others.

WHO MAY ATTEND? Anyone seeking Jesus is welcome to attend. **You do not need to be a parish member. This course is open to anyone.**
